May Volunteer of the Month



Kearney/Buffalo County CASA is proud to honor Connie Choquette of Upland for her advocacy for abused and neglected children. Connie has been a CASA volunteer for five and a half years and has been an advocate for 3 different families. Connie takes the time to give each child she advocates for individual time each week, time that is just focused on them. She is that consistent person for the child and is there for them from the beginning of the case until the end. She observes them interacting with their parents, tracks parental progress, attends team meetings, appears at court hearings, and advocates and works with the team to make sure that decisions on the case uphold the child's best interests and that the children find a safe, permanent home, as soon as possible.

Connie says, "I started because I wanted to volunteer and someone suggested it. What got me really hooked was when after I wrote my first court report a lawyer asked me how I got the kid to tell me that. I went to my supervisor, because I didn't know how to handle that question. The kid had just told me and I didn't think I had done anything special. My supervisor said that since I visit once a week, I may have built a better relationship with the child than any relationship they have. That broke my heart to know that one hour a week with the child of focused attention was more than they were getting anywhere else. It made me realize how important it was that there be someone in their life they can trust."



The Early Development Network program serves children birth through age three who are not developing typically or who have been diagnosed with a health condition that will affect their development. Some of the services they provide would include but are not limited to; services coordination, parent to parent support, parenting information, early childhood special education, speech/language pathology, physical therapy, occupational therapy, vision screening, audiology, and assistive technology devices and services. They provide service coordination for EDN in 9 central NE counties and serve in 27 school districts. In the month of March, they hit an all time high of serving 207 families in 1 month!

Court Appointed Special Advocates are appointed by the Court judge to represent the best interest of abused and neglected children in the court system. A CASA volunteer acts as the "eyes and ears" of children involved in court proceedings, and offer judges a critical perspective of what is in the best interests of each child, based on information gathered first-hand through research, interviews, and observations. Studies show that once a CASA volunteer is assigned to an abused or neglected child that the child is much more likely to receive vital services such as health care, education, and therapy. By getting involved as a CASA, you can help create healthier families and communities - and change the course of a child's life.
